LEED: Streamlined, Refined, and Online

USGBC has announced a series of major enhancements to the LEED Rating System certification process at the 2005 Greenbuild Conference and Expo in Atlanta, GA. The result of a nearly year-long process involving extensive customer feedback and market research, the LEED process innovations will greatly reduce the LEED documentation process time, paperwork, and cost. The result is that LEED projects can now submit 100% of their documentation on-line.
